Pause and Reflect 4.8

- i. *patronize:* the relation between *patron* as in *patron of the arts* may have been lost for some people but not for others.
- ii. *lionize*: the use of *lion* to refer to someone that is successful appears first in the nineteenth century. Because we don't use this expression in the same way it is possible that the relation of the root *lion* to the verb has been lost.
- iii. *pasteurize*: this word will only be transparent for those who know that Louis Pasteur (1822-1895) was the author of the process of killing microbes in milk and other beverages that we now refer to as pasteurization.
- iv. *authorize*: the relation between *author* and *authorize* is not transparent, as the verb refers to the action of giving someone authority to do something, not to producing something as the author.
- v. *legalize* to make legal, is transparent to most people.
- vi. *idolize*, to revere someone, maintains its relation to *idol* and is therefore transparent for most people.
